Stephen Gumley Scholarship

About

This scholarship is for a new student entering Year 7 who is Tasmanian born from a Tasmanian resident family not previously educated at the School. It is for 50% of tuition fees and tenable to completion of Year 12.

Biography

Dr Stephen Gumley AO ('74) attended Hutchins from 1966-1974. In 1965 Dr Stephen Gumley won a competitive examination for a scholarship to attend The Hutchins School. He entered Year 4 via the P H Rocket Scholarship. Steve would now like to give like-minded others the chance to do the same. A Rhodes scholar, Dr Gumley was awarded a Doctor of Philosophy from St Catherine's College, University of Oxford in 1982 and an MBA from the University of Tasmania in 1994. After roles as CEO of Tasmanian Technology and export manufacturer Global Lightning Technologies Group, he then went on to become a Vice President of Boeing in Seattle USA and then CEO of the Australian Submarine Corporation. In 2004 Dr Gumley was appointed the inaugural CEO of the Defence Materiel Organisation (DMO) in Canberra responsible for acquiring and sustaining all Australia's military equipment. In 2010 he was made an Officer of the Order of Australia as well as a Doctor of Engineering Honoris Causa from the University of Tasmania.

Selection criteria

Application is open to a Tasmanian born student from a Tasmanian resident family not previously educated at the School. For the purpose of this scholarship, 'not previously educated' shall mean that no sibling, parent or grandparent has ever been a student at The Hutchins School. All students must also meet the School's eligibility requirements for enrolment.

Application is open to a student who has attained merit with a focus on academic excellence in mathematics and science. The awarding of the scholarship will be determined by a process conducted by the Registrar. Each candidate will:

- Undertake a mathematics and science aptitude test.
- Submit a resume showcasing what they have done in mathematics and science. The resume must include, but is not limited to:
 - a) any investigations the applicant has completed;
 - b) which competitions the applicant has been in; and
 - c) any additional co-curricular mathematics and science activities they have undertaken.





Selection process

All applicants will be acknowledged. Based on the results of the testing and after review of the applicant's resume, candidates may be invited to attend a subsequent formal interview.

Not all applicants may proceed to an interview and The Hutchins School reserves the right to not award the scholarship if no suitable candidate is found.

Terms and conditions

The holder of this scholarship is required to:

- achieve a satisfactory level of academic excellence in any given year in both science and mathematics subjects; participate in other mathematics and science activities as directed by the Heads of Mathematics and Science;
- in Year 11 or 12, undertake at least one pre-tertiary subject in both mathematics and science; and
- work to the best of their abilities at their studies, be a contributor to the life of the School and uphold the School's values of kindness, courage, respect and humility at all times.

Failure to fulfil any of the responsibilities above may result in forfeiture of the scholarship at the discretion of the Headmaster.
