Outstanding ATAR results sit alongside equally impressive achievements in Vocational Education and Training qualifications, reflecting our school's Vision to provide an inspirational education in which each student is encouraged to strive for their personal best and to serve their community.

Whether pursuing tertiary pathways, industry-based training, or a combination of both, our students have demonstrated commitment, resilience, and a strong sense of purpose. These results affirm the importance of providing diverse and rigorous pathways that recognise individual strengths, honour different aspirations, and prepare our students for further study, the workforce, and life beyond school.

The excellent results achieved by our Year 12 cohort are a powerful testament to the students' hard work, commitment and perseverance throughout the year, and to the dedication of our highly skilled staff who inspired, challenged and supported every student to achieve their personal best.

Key achievements include:

- Three students achieving an ATAR above 99, placing them in the top 1% of students in the State. Congratulations go to Kevin Shen 99.9, Lucas Baumwol 99.75, and Tian Li 99.55.
- 9.9% of Year 12 ATAR eligible students achieved an ATAR above 98.
- 19 students achieved an ATAR above 95.
- Hutchins students were listed 30 times for achieving the highest score possible in a pre-tertiary subject.

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- 26 students undertook qualifications in Automotive, Construction, Hospitality, Fitness, Dance, Aviation, Electrotech and Hospitality at Certificate II and III levels. Several students have now secured apprenticeships directly related to their VET area of study, with several students who undertook School Based Apprenticeships continuing into full time employment.
- 89 students completed short vocational course qualifications.
- Joshua Fielding won the Tasmanian School-based Apprentice of the Year award before being awarded the Australian School-based Apprentice of the Year.

Success at Hutchins is not defined by league tables, rank orders, or comparisons with others. While final examination and course results mark an important milestone, they represent only a small part of the rich and varied experiences that shape each student's learning journey. The academic results summarised in this document reflect more than thirteen years of learning, and on behalf of our students and their families, I extend my sincere thanks to every teacher and staff member who has inspired, guided, motivated, and supported students throughout their time at the School.


